OAKLAND, CALIFORNIA: The Superior Court of Alameda County announces new collections vendor and new payment options for delinquent Traffic cases.

The Superior Court of Alameda County announced today that effective July 1, 2019, it will partner with Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson, LLP to provide collection services on the Court's behalf.

Court users with outstanding Traffic Court fees and fines that have already been referred to collections will still be able to pay those by debit or credit card via phone or online, or by sending a check to Linebarger. Payment instructions are available on the Court's web site at

In addition, under the Court's agreement with Linebarger, individuals can now also pay their Traffic accounts by making cash payments using the PayNearMe service. PayNearMe allows for case payments to be made at locations such as 7-Eleven, CVS, and other name brand stores throughout the community, without incurring any additional transaction fee. PayNearMe offers true convenience to people who do not have debit cards, credit cards, or checking accounts, or who do not want to pay an additional fee for a cashier's check. All payments are traceable, and the person making a payment walks away with a receipt.
